We have lived here for 10 years and have been here for most of the 3L saga. We visited the CVRD in 2009, when we first heard about the possibility of a developer wanting to put in a subdivision by Stotan Falls. Having spoken to several CVRD staff members over those years, we do have a background in how complicated this became. And here we are, all these years later, trying to sort this out.

To us, the matter is simple (although we know it has become anything but). We were part of the public input into the birth of the RGS (Regional Growth Strategy)– a long process of cooperative consultation and study with Courtenay, Comox and Cumberland. And then it was complete. Certainly it was impossible to create a plan that would be perfect to all concerned, but it was firmly? adopted with its long range plans for how to best handle the Comox Valley’s inevitable growth.

And then the developer resurfaced with his detailed proposal to build an enormous subdivision on RU20 land, to be called, Riverwood, and here we all are.

So back to the simple part. That land IS RU20 and was designated as such for good reason. It is not one of the RGS’s official growth nodes. Period. If this development goes through, all faith will be lost in our elected

leaders and it will cast doubt on the integrity of the CVRD and the RGS. All to accommodate the wishes of one developer?? We think every valley resident will be able to draw upon personal experience of 'making an exception' and regretting that decision. "You let him have it. Why can't I have that? I have even better reasons~!"

It's wrong to say 'yes' to them.

And yes, there are many, many reasons why we feel a development in that location would be folly, but that's not what this process is all about. Someone asked me last week whether I would be 'okay' with this plan if it was in another location in the valley. I said, Absolutely. IF and only if it was in one of the official settlement nodes. If it wasn't, then, No~! We realize that there were unforeseen legal issues that arose during this process but it is our understanding that we are now at the stage where this can be vetoed as it was originally.

We resent the enormous amount of time and money this proposal, with all its drama, has cost the CVRD and all the taxpayers. There are many other issues in the Comox Valley that need that time, focus and tax dollars.

We are trusting you to make the best decisions for all of us. Again, our deep appreciation for your time and dedication to all the work you do.

Here is the petition that was posted to Facebook on August 31st. The petition states: "*I, the undersigned, do not agree that 3L Developments should be allowed to amend the Regional Growth Strategy to allow for a new settlement node of 750-1100 homes near Stotan Falls.*"

As of today's date (Sept. 24th) we have collected **1683 signatures**. Last week's tally of 1529 signatures determined the following. Of particular interest are signatures from those residing in the CVRD - **467 signatures**. We also received **38 signatures** from adjacent regions. The remaining signatures were from other regions on Vancouver Island and some of the outer islands, Vancouver, the Lower Mainland and all across BC.

*Attached find two PDFs with signatures and comments received.*

It seems that this is not strictly a regional issue as we received signatures from people all across Canada (especially Alberta) and from the U.S. and other Nations. Some people (515) only indicated their country, not their province or city. Of course it is impossible to determine from this survey but it makes me wonder if those from outside of our region are family, friends or tourists.

We found this comment of particular interest, "Been flying over to good old Comox Valley, from Denmark since 1985, the first place I always wanted to go was Stotan Falls, it was also the first thing I took my girlfriend to see when we were over in 2015...It would NOT be the same if it was running through a residential area! Free Natural Stotan FOREVER."

We think it is safe to say that **over 500 people** in our area have taken the time to object to the proposed amendment to the RGS. They do not want a new Settlement Node established in the Comox Valley. Say no to the amendment at the First Reading. Save everyone a lot of time and money and stop urban sprawl.

Background:

3L Developments owns 525 acres of land around the Stotan Falls area. They are proposing to build a new community called RiverWood of up to 1100 homes in an area without water, sewage or road infrastructure, and zoned RU-20, which allows for two homes per fifty acres. 3L wants the CVRD (Comox Valley Regional District) to amend our Regional Growth Strategy so this land can be re-zoned as a new Settlement Node.

The CVRD approved a Public Consultation process to assess this, and the next opportunity for public input is a CVRD Open House at Filberg on Thursday, September 6th. The consultation process will seek input from all our adjoining Regional Districts, as well as First Nations.

3L also claims if they can build their project, they will give the Comox Valley a 'free' 260 acre park in exchange. Their promo ignores the facts about how much is already secured as public land by riparian restrictions and steep slope legislation, plus the likely impacts to wildlife corridors, salmon watershed areas, and of course, the beauty of Stotan Falls which has to be preserved for future generations. Stotan Falls won't be turned into a park by building 1100 homes on top of it.

This development must not go forward as proposed. Please sign this petition and share widely on social media. As a resident of the Comox Valley since 1962 I am well aware of the natural beauty of this area and it's attractiveness to prospective homeowners. In short, we have everything – even being linked to the rest of the world by improved communication links, airlines, and ferries.

Increased population movement into our area does pose the question of where to develop properties. This area was denuded of its magnificent forest 80 – 100 years ago. The second growth has re-consumed the land and is only now being logged again. Opening the land has altered drainage patterns, and moisture absorption rates while issuing deleterious materials into our waterways. Siltation into our rivers and streams renders the spawning gravels and stream structure inaccessible to our spawning anadromous and native fish species to say nothing of the negative affects on the hyporheic zone fauna. I can't visualize how the development of the 3L properties bordering two of our most beautiful Comox Valley watershed rivers cannot possible bring about further destruction to an already greatly destroyed fish habitat.

If the properties in question are to be developed has thought been given to access to hospital, schools, etc. (Yes, we have anew bridge over the Tsolum)? Is the only access to the properties from the logging road and/or Piercy Road? What of the water source? The Browns River, once Courtenay's source, is not a viable option (right now it is almost dry). Water removed from the primordial river area (the major water removal being via the penstock to the powerhouse) is not a reasonable option. Perhaps a connection to the new deep water Comox Lake installation is in mind?

Pollution in the form of water runoff from roads, insecticides, cleansing agents, etc. impact our natural environment. Wouldn't the development, 3L, have to ban fossil fuel and wood burning appliances to guarantee healthy quality standards. A thousand homes burning wood is quite a thought. Would tapping into the natural gas line going to Victoria be their solution?

I understand that the 3L development co-owns a considerable tract of land, including a logging road through which access has been prohibited. Was this logging conduit not developed by the taxpayers of B.C. in concert with Comox Logging and other logging companies? What of ownership of the riverbed, as I understand it -- Riparian rights? Such a situation is common in Europe but I didn't think it existed in B.C. At the time of

the last election I tried to get an answer to this question from one of the political parties but received no satisfaction. This question of riparian rights is deserving of a thorough discussion.


The Puntledge River area is rich in fossils. Would a significant population increase not impact and exacerbate the removal of these artifacts even greater than now exists?

In closing, these issues are serious considerations in any granting of permits, permissions, etc. to the development of a property such as exists in a fragile natural environment.

I have lived on Greaves Crescent for over 30 years and some time ago my neighbour and I were successful in obtaining access to municipal water for our area. This success was due to the fact that studies reveal that a coliform content in the hundreds parts per million necessitated the purveyor of water (B.C. Government) to supply water of suitable quality. I just wonder what the river water quality would be if the population density of the area in question becomes a reality.

Because these are watershed issues and necessarily impact on fish, the Department of Fisheries must be an important contributor to any discussions.

In conclusion, I am strongly against any development of the forest lands on the Puntledge/Browns Rivers watersheds. I look forward to continued discussions of these issues.

The fact that someone can own a river bed is ridiculous. I don't understand why the local government cannot do something to overturn this. Erecting a private toll booth to access Stotan Falls says a lot about this man.

I was born in the Comox Valley and lived there for 25 years. My heart sinks every time I come home to find another beautiful swimming spot (and river access) that we enjoyed as a family blocked off...access denied. I am angry about this.

Someone has failed to preserve river accesses and green spaces and some of the new developments have been poorly conceived. The Airpark and trails are a great example of something to be celebrated, as are the Hydro trails. But many swimspots that were so obviously needing to be protected as parkland have been lost for generations due to lack of foresight and poor planning. Trails that were used for many years have been blocked off by private land owners, access denied. This cannot keep happening; it keeps the majority from recreational and economic opportunities, and erodes the natural beauty that is the crown jewel of Comox Valley. People love this place because of the forests, the bike trails, the wild spaces.

The flood plains on the 'town' side of the Condensory River bridge are a prime example of what should have been a park. I can envision a green space, picnic benches, and safe bike and car parking areas. Here, so close to the downtown core, we lost the opportunity to create a good sized park. This would have increased revenues for local business by facilitating visitors for eagle watching, kayak launching, tubing, and fishing. Instead people must park along a busy road, crossing perilously to get to the river and squeeze onto a crowded bank. Meantime, you have townhouses perched on the edge of an eroding bank; homes for maybe a dozen people on land that hundreds, perhaps thousands, could have enjoyed.

Please do what you can to ensure the public has the right to recreate on lands we have accessed for many years.

I ask you to stand up and represent the interests of the people; preserve what is beautiful about the Comox Valley. Please stand together against this proposal, uphold the community's values, stand behind your Regional Growth Strategy.

I am a concerned Comox Valley resident - have raised my family of four children in the Valley..after choosing the Comox Valley as a good place to bring up family and teach them the values of the outdoors, a good education, and to respect Nature..with access to easy skiing (cross country as a family), hiking, camping, fishing, and swimming.
