Purpose

To seek the board's support to execute an agreement with the City of Courtenay for shared use of the Civic Room to accommodate their council meetings.

Recommendation from the Chief Administrative Officer:

THAT staff be authorized to execute a facility use agreement with the City of Courtenay for use of the CVRD Civic Room, as generally outlined in the staff report dated October 1, 2021.

Executive Summary

With the construction of the new regional district office building on Harmston Avenue, the Comox Valley Reginal District (CVRD) Civic Room provides for a combined boardroom and emergency operations centre.

Due to space constraints within their City Hall Council Chambers, the City of Courtenay has proposed to utilize the CVRD Civic Rom to conduct their Council meetings and certain emergency operations. Staff from both local governments have collaborated in the drafting of a facility use agreement to detail the proposed arrangements and the responsibilities of the parties.

Use of the facilities by the City of Courtenay is not anticipated to pose a significant impact to CVRD business or operations as regularly scheduled meetings by the parties generally do not conflict. Further, the new office building has provided for increased meeting spaces in addition to offering enhanced virtual/remote hosting capabilities.

The proposed agreement generally provides for the City of Courtenay's use of the Civic Room facilities under the following terms:

- Use by the City is reserved for Monday's from 2:00pm onwards to accommodate their regular Council meeting schedule and any special meetings or other legislative functions, such as public hearings. Meetings of the CVRD's Electoral Areas Services Committee (EASC) are held on Mondays, commencing at 10:00am, however they are generally concluded before 2:00pm.
- As the Civic Room will also function as an emergency operations centre for both parties
 during certain emergency events, such use shall take priority. It is noted however, that the
 operable wall can mitigate these impacts by dividing the facilities so that both uses may
 occur at the same time.

- The CVRD is responsible for the general maintenance and repair of the facilities unless specific damage occurs in connection with the City's use.
- As the City's use will present minor increases in janitorial and other ancillary costs, the agreement provides for a monthly fee of \$400.
- The term of the agreement is for five years.
