BYLAW NO. 531

A bylaw to amend the Fanny Bay Fire Protection Service Regulations to regulate high-risk activities in order to protect public health and safety and property

WHEREAS the Comox Valley Regional District adopted Bylaw No. 283 being "Fanny Bay Fire Protection Service Regulation Bylaw No. 283, 2013" on November 26, 2013;

AND WHEREAS the board desires to update the bylaw to include regulations for high-risk activities in order to protect public health and safety and property;

NOW THEREFORE the board of the Comox Valley Regional District in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

Amendment

- 1. Bylaw No. 283 being "Fanny Bay Fire Protection Service Regulation Bylaw No. 283, 2013" is hereby amended by:
 - (a) Inserting a new definition in alphabetic order to section 1 as follows:
 - "high risk activity means mechanical brushing; disk trenching; preparation or use of explosives; using fire- or spark-producing tools, including cutting tools; using or preparing fireworks or pyrotechnics; grinding, including rail grinding; mechanical land clearing; clearing and maintaining rights of way, including grass mowing; any of the following activities carried out in a cutblock excluding a road, landing, roadside work area or log sort area in the cutblock:
 - i. operating a power saw;
 - ii. mechanical tree felling, woody debris piling or tree processing, including de-limbing;
 - iii. welding;
 - iv. portable wood chipping, milling, processing or manufacturing;
 - v. skidding logs or log forwarding unless it is improbable that the skidding or forwarding will result in the equipment contacting rock;
 - vi. yarding logs using cable systems."
 - (b) Replacing section 2(1) which reads as follows:

"This bylaw applies to outdoor fires, beach fires and camp fires on all privatelyowned and publicly-owned properties located in the Fanny Bay fire protection service area."

With the following section 2(1) which reads as follows:

"This bylaw applies to all privately-owned and publicly-owned properties located in the Fanny Bay fire protection service area."

(c) Inserting a new section 6 (high risk activities) which reads:

"If at any time the Fire Chief deems it advisable, the Fire Chief may order one or more High Risk Activities to be prohibited for a specified period of time." and renumbering following sections as required.

This Bylaw No. 531 may be cited as "Fanny Bay Fire Protection Service Regulation Bylaw No. 283, 2013, Amendment No. 1".
