Against all odds, through the COVID-19 pandemic, we leveraged a **10-fold return** on our Community Works Fund Grant from the EASC.

In October 2023 we achieved "lock-up" status, despite rising building costs and supply shortages.

We're now working the finishing touches, aiming to open the doors in 2024.



The new Arts Centre is a place with open-door public access, where we'll hold space for the Indigenous Keepers of this Land.

We hold space for Reconciliation in our annual Indigenous Peoples' month celebrations.

We're landscaping our Arts Centre with Indigenous Medicine Gardens and diverseability accessible interpretive trails, funded by Co-op Community Spaces and led by Pentlatch First Nation Elder Barb Whyte (Billy).

Our new Centre and future programming will continue to honor and recognise Indigenous artists, performers, and knowledge keepers.



We're proud of our community for embracing both the costs and benefits of this brand-new facility serving the whole CVRD.

The new Arts Centre is a place where we can proudly welcome many more of the 40,000 annual visitors to our remote rural community, who support our recreational/cultural economy.

It's a where we can finally gather indoors, year-round, and continue to inspire one another.
