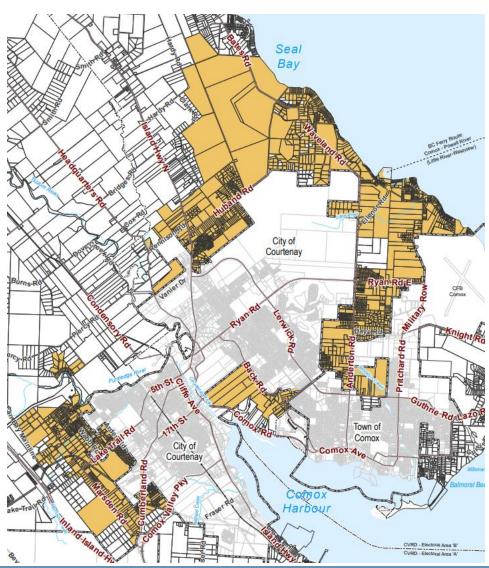
# CVRD 2021 – 2025 Financial Plan

## Purpose / Overview of Service

- Distributes bulk water from CVWS
- Previously the 6 WLSA's surrounding Comox and Courtenay operated as individual service area
- In 2018 these were aggregated into the current CVWLSA, which now includes approximately 2,120 metered connections
- Several smaller services still exist to collect parcel taxes

## 2020 Work Plan Accomplishments

- Completed preventative maintenance for Fire Hydrants, Air Valves and PRVs
- Completed a full infrastructure inventory on GIS based 'collector app'
- Purchased CityWorks (multi function CMMS)
- Upgraded last sample location to new station
- Completed a Slope Stability Assessment for the Waveland/Wilkinson rd watermain







#### 2021 Work Plan Priorities

- Complete the CityWorks CMMS implementation and rollout
- Comprehensive system dead end flushing program
- Finalize licensing with Province to incorporate Sandwick Reservoir site into existing Park Use Plan
