
Purpose / Overview of Service

- DIWLSA was constructed in 1969 and became a regional district service in 1972 to resolve water quality concerns
- DIWLSA consists of 23 properties
- Day to day operations of DIWLSA are managed by the Graham Lake Improvement District (GLID)
- Revenue for the service is collected through a flat rate



2019 Work Plan Accomplishments


- All properties located between DIWLSA and GLID were offered the opportunity to be connected to the system
- Progressed conversion study for GLID to become a CVRD service
- Water treatment options study and pilot testing completed
- Initiated grant application for installation of new treatment infrastructure





2020 Work Plan Priorities

- Continue discussions with GLID on amalgamation of the two services
- Submit application for round 2 of ICIP funding
- Consult with GLID and DIWLSA users
- Work towards possible conversion for Jan 1, '20
