# Purpose

The purpose of this report is to apprise the board of Denman Island's proposed Bylaw No. 225 (see Appendix A), a general amendment to prohibit the use of vehicles and ground-based machinery in the Island's water zones (see Appendix B).

### **Policy Analysis**

The Comox Valley Regional District's (CVRD) Official Community Plan (OCP) contains a range of policies intended to support the aquaculture industry as a key economic driver and to balance that support with assessment of the impact of the industry on the marine environment and upland land uses/users. The OCP, does not however apply to lands/water within the jurisdiction of the Islands Trust.

Aquaculture licenses are issued by Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and tenures are granted by the Ministry of Forests, Lands, and Natural Resource Operations.

# **Executive Summary**

- There is no overlap in the CVRD's and the Islands Trust's zoning jurisdiction;
- Islands Trust's proposed amendment will prohibit the use of vehicles and other groundbased machinery from entering Denman's water zones except where federally licensed aquaculture operations are entitled to this equipment in accordance with an aquaculture license;
- Islands Trust has identified one water zone, being W3, where aquaculture can be undertaken;
- It appears that the proposed bylaw may be used to limit existing aquaculture operators from accessing tenures within the W3 zone (i.e. access provided by traversing a W1 zone) as well as limiting the expansion of operations into areas of the foreshore that are not presently zoned for aquaculture;
- The CVRD supports aquaculture and staff is concerned that Denman's proposed bylaw may negatively impact the aquaculture industry within the jurisdiction of the Islands Trust, ultimately impacting the regional industry.

# Recommendation from the Acting Chief Administrative Officer:

THAT the Denman Island Trust Committee be advised that the CVRD is concerned that proposed Bylaw No. 225, being a bylaw to amend the Denman Island Land Use Bylaw No. 186, 2008 by adding a general prohibition against the use of vehicles and ground-based machinery in the W1, W3 and W4 zones, applicable to the majority of the Denman Island marine foreshore, may negatively impact current and future lawful access to aquaculture tenures by aquaculture operators and request that the Denman Island Trust Committee consult with the aquaculture industry before processing further. # **Background/Current Situation**

In a December 2016 report to the Islands Trust Council, Islands Trust staff state that "there has been a growing concern over the last several years about increased industrial and recreational use of the marine waters of the Trust area". The report identifies a range of marine protection tools that the Trust can consider in implementing its provincial mandate to preserve and protect the Trust area. Zoning is among the tools that is identified that can be used to regulate land use (including regulation over the surface of the water).

The Denman Island Trust Committee has defined four marine water zones. Aquaculture is a permitted use in one of those zones, the W3 zone (see Appendix B). While not bound to abide local zoning, it has been the CVRD's experience that DFO considers local government zoning in its issuance of aquaculture licenses.

CVRD staff understands, through its work on the Baynes Sound Initiative, that many of Denman's aquaculture operators access their foreshore tenures by motorized vehicle and/or use vehicles and other ground-based machinery to harvest their product. It would appear that for these operators a restriction on vehicular access within the foreshore will impact their ability to operate, notwithstanding the part of Denman's proposed bylaw that acknowledges that some licenses include a provision to operate vehicles/other ground-based machinery. Staff is concerned that the proposed bylaw, if adopted, may be used to prevent issuance of future licenses given DFO's past recognition of local government zoning.

# Options

- 1. Advise the Islands Trust (Denman Island Trust Committee) that the CVRD is concerned that the proposed bylaw will negatively impact the regional aquaculture industry;
- 2. Refer the matter back to staff with direction on next steps.

Staff recommends option 1.

# **Financial Factors**

There are no financial factors arising from staff's recommendation.

# Legal Factors

There are no legal factors arising from staff's recommendation. Aquaculture is broadly permitted within the CVRD's Baynes Sound jurisdiction. While zoning can be used to identify locations where aquaculture can locate, zoning authority does not extend to regulating the practice of the industry.

# **Regional Growth Strategy Implications**

The Regional Growth Strategy (RGS) does not apply to Denman Island, however, as a regional source of employment, the RGS maintains that existing shellfish farms and tenures should be

protected with no net loss. A bylaw that may have the effect of prohibiting lawful access may result in the functional loss of an existing tenure.

### **Intergovernmental Factors**

The Islands Trust issued this referral to a range of First Nations and agencies, including the K'omoks First Nation.

### Interdepartmental Involvement

Planning staff have undertaken the review of the Islands Trust's proposed bylaw.

### Citizen/Public Relations

There are no citizen/public relations matters arising from the recommendation contained within this report.

# BYLAW NO. 225

A bylaw to amend the Land Use Bylaw to prohibit the use of vehicles and ground based machinery on the foreshore in the W1, W3 and W4 zones.

The Denman Island Local Trust Committee, being the Local Trust Committee having jurisdiction in respect of the Denman Island Local Trust Area in the Province of British Columbia pursuant to the *Islands Trust Act*, enacts as follows:

- 1 Denman Island Land Use Bylaw No. 186, cited as "Denman Island Land Use Bylaw, 2008", is amended as detailed on attached Schedule 'A' of this amending bylaw.
- 2 This Bylaw may be cited as "Denman Island Land Use Bylaw No. 186, 2008, Amendment No 1, 2017".

### Schedule 'A'

# 1. PART 3 ZONE REGULATIONS, Section 3.7 Water Zoning Tables is amended by the addition of a new "Table 5 – Prohibited Uses" as shown below:

### Table 5 – Prohibited Uses

The regulations listed in this table are intended to be applied in conjunction with the provisions of Table1, "Permitted Uses" in order to provide additional guidance and clarity on acceptable implementation actions and practices associated with the permitted uses

Zoning Code	Regulations
W1, W3, W4	Despite Table 1 of this Section, the use of vehicles and ground based machinery on the foreshore is prohibited.

**INFORMATION NOTE**: Aquaculture operations in the W3 zone that are licensed under the *Fisheries Act* (Canada) may be entitled to operate vehicles or ground based machinery in accordance with the terms of the license.
