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April 16 follow up

- January 2017 report to Sewage Commission included ambiguous language, some of which implied that recommended odour improvements would allow facility to achieve Ontario standard
- 2. May 2019 staff report, on your agenda, implied that sewage commission directed staff to undertake follow up study
- 3. Until April 2019 CVRD website underplayed level of complaints from neighborhood, including statement that around 10 complaints were received per year



April 16 CRRA concerns

- 1. Continued concerns surrounding odour, specifically from the bioreactors.
- 2. Location of the equalization (EQ) basin proposed for construction at the Comox Valley Water Pollution Control Centre (CVWPCC).



Odour control

- Long and convoluted history
- However since 2016 methodical approach
 - 2016 odour study
 - 2017 design and tender scope to reduce odours by >80%
 - 2018 installation
 - 2019 follow up odour study and decision on further action if required
- Law of diminishing returns
 - Resolving remaining <20% estimated at \$3-\$5M
- Covering bioreactors likely nec. to meet Ont. Standard



EQ basin

- Urgently needed
- Shift back to original location has significantly reduced costs and constraints on future expansion of plant
- Will only be used a handful of times per year and residents likely won't ever see it in operation
- Procurement will start this month
- Regular updates to residents
- Construction finished by Nov 2019







Landscaping plan

- Excavated soil from EQ basin to be used to build berms
 - restore and improve visual barrier and reduce funnel effect
- Staff to develop draft landscape plan for berms
- Consult with CRRA to ensure plan will satisfy concerns





Communications protocol

- To be developed in consultation with residents to:
 - Formalize notifications re ops and odour impacts
 - Minimum timelines
 - Method of communication
 - Who to communicate with
 - Update to website to make it easy to find information on odour and make a complaint
 - Include process for tracking and reporting odour complaints
- Once finalized, will become policy to ensure continuity
